Change Batteries for Daylight Saving Time

Daylight Saving Time begins at 2 a.m. Sunday, March 13. When you set your clocks ahead, the Wheaton Fire Department suggests that you replace the batteries in your smoke and carbon monoxide detectors, too.

Replacing the batteries approximately every six months helps ensure they are functioning properly, and daylight saving time is a good way to remind yourself when you last replaced the batteries.

Attend Meeting March 2 to See Proposed Design Choices

Big changes are coming for downtown Wheaton, and you can help determine what those changes will look like.

The City will host a public meeting at 7 p.m. Wednesday, March 2 at Wheaton City Hall, 303 W. Wesley St., to get your input on downtown streetscape improvements.

The City has contracted with Design Workshop, a landscape architecture firm, to assist with the first phase of implementing elements of the Downtown Strategic Plan. This plan will focus on streetscape improvements,



gathering areas, signage and other changes to enhance downtown Wheaton.

Design Workshop will present options and solicit input to help guide the final design plans during the

March 2 meeting. If you are unable to attend, there will be an opportunity for residents to share their feedback online. More information will be posted on the City's website after the meeting.

Yard Waste Pickup Resumes April 4

Yard waste pickup in Wheaton resumes on your collection day during the first week of April. As a reminder, yard waste can be placed either in containers no larger than 33 gallons in volume or in biodegradable bags.

Each container or bag needs a blue yard waste sticker – the same sticker that is used for garbage collection.

If containers are not feasible, brush and tree trimmings must be placed in stacks no longer than 4 feet in length and 18 inches in diameter. Stacks do not need to be bundled with twine but must have a garbage/yard waste sticker attached.

Police: Be Alert for IRS Tax Scams

Learn what you should watch for to avoid being scammed

As Tax Day for 2016 approaches, criminals will be trying to take advantage of taxpayers by impersonating Internal Revenue Service and Treasury employees. The phone fraud scam uses automated robocalls to contact victims. The criminals provide fake names, badge numbers and may even have basic information about the victim.

The Wheaton Police Department would like to remind you that the Internal Revenue Service will never:

- Call to demand immediate payment, nor will the IRS call about taxes owed without first corresponding by mail.
- Demand that you pay taxes without giving you the opportunity to question or appeal the amount they say you owe.

If you don't owe taxes and receive a phone call from someone claiming to be from the IRS asking for money:

- Do not give the caller any information and hang up immediately.
- Contact the Treasury Inspector General for Tax Administration (www.treasury.gov/tigta/contact_report_scam.shtml) 800-829-1040
- Report it to the Federal Trade Commission at www.FTC.gov
- Report it to the Wheaton Police Department.

The proposed budget will be available on the City's website before the budget workshop sessions.


The City Council has scheduled a public hearing on the budget for April 11.

The General Primary Election to nominate federal, state and county candidates by an established party will take place on Tuesday, March 15, 2016. Polls are open from 6 a.m. to 7 p.m.

Registered voters who would like to use the early voting option to vote in the General Primary Election may

The Wheaton location is at the DuPage County Election Commission Office, 421 N. County Farm Road. Hours are 8:30 a.m. to 7:30 p.m. Monday through Friday; 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. Saturday; and 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. Sunday.

In addition, if you are not yet registered to vote but would like to register, you can use the expanded "grace period" registration and voting option. Recent Illinois legislation allows residents who are eligible to vote to register up to and on Election Day. You

can register at the Election Commission office through March 14, or register at your polling place on Election Day (March 15).

ComEd Issues Scam Alert

ComEd has seen an increase in reports of individuals calling ComEd customers and falsely claiming their electric service will be disconnected unless payment is made.

These impersonators instruct customers to buy a prepaid credit card and call back to a different phone number with the personal identification number (PIN) or other personal information. They also use a tactic called "spoofing" to manipulate the Caller ID displayed phone number so that it appears as a ComEd number.

ComEd representatives will never call you to ask you for cash or request that you purchase a prepaid credit card to make a payment on your bill. If you have concerns about the status of your account, call ComEd's Customer Service line at: 800-334-7661.

If you believe you have been the target of a phone scam, ComEd urges you to contact the Illinois Attorney General's office at 800-386-5438, or visit the Illinois Attorney General's website and [click on the "Protecting Consumers" link](#).
