Front Street Underground Utility Construction Work Under Way

If you've been to downtown Wheaton lately, you've probably noticed quite a bit of construction activity. That's because the first phase of improvements in the City's Downtown Streetscape Plan is forging ahead. This phase of work involves underground utility upgrades along Front Street from Cross Street to West Street.

Throughout this part of the project, crews may be temporarily closing lanes of traffic, and parking may be affected. Traffic may be temporarily detoured at times to allow crews to complete portions of the project. To find alternate parking, visit the City's website to see all parking options in the downtown.

Do not blow or rake leaves into the street. This can block storm sewers and possibly lead to flooding issues. Please help remove leaves and sticks near the storm sewers that are near your house to help them function properly.

Leaf Collection Reminders

This fall, the City of Wheaton reminds you of its procedures for leaf disposal. Place leaves in containers 35 gallons in size or smaller, or in biodegradable bags. Containers or bags must weigh less than 50 pounds when filled. Each container or bag requires a Lakeshore Recycling Systems yard waste/organics/excess garbage sticker, which is available at City Hall and at many local grocery and hardware stores.

Think it's OK to leave your car unlocked in your driveway? This might change your mind.

Many Chicago suburbs – including Wheaton – have seen a significant increase in car burglaries this summer. The Wheaton Police Department has found that in each instance, the car's

owner left it unlocked.

Wheaton Police Department detectives received more than 70 reports of items being stolen from unlocked Wheaton vehicles this summer. And if the suspects found car keys in the unlocked cars, they have taken the cars, as well,

providing a means for them to commit far more serious crimes.

Helpful Hints for a Safe Halloween

Tips from Wheaton Police Department

Halloween is a festive and fun time of the year for children of all ages. In Wheaton, the official trick-or-treating hours are from 3 p.m. to 7 p.m. Tuesday, Oct. 31.

The Wheaton Police Department offers the following tips to promote safety and protect children:

- Remind children to trick-or-treat on one side of the street at a time. Refrain from crossing the street in the middle of the block or between parked cars. Cross the street only in the crosswalk or at the corner, using caution.

- Trick-or-treat while it is light outside. If you must be out after dark, wear white or light-colored clothing, put reflective tape on your costume and treat bag, and carry a flashlight so you can be seen.

- Dress children in non-flammable costumes that fit properly – short enough to prevent tripping. Avoid wearing facial masks, which obstruct vision. Use face paint and makeup instead.

- Trick-or-treat with friends and stay in a group;



there is safety in numbers. Never trick-or-treat alone.

- Make sure young children are accompanied by an adult (parent) or responsible teen (older brother or sister) while trick-or-treating.

- Advise children not to enter any residence or vehicle for the promise of anything. Children should wait outside the door for their treats.

- Plan your trick-or-treat route ahead of time, staying in your own immediate neighborhood, along well-lighted streets. Do not wander far from home.

- Instruct children never to eat any treats until they return home and the treats have been examined under sufficient light by an adult. Check the wrappers of

commercial candy for signs of tampering. Wash and cut fruit before eating. Throw away anything unwrapped. Notify the police if there are any suspicious treats.

- Always walk on the sidewalk while trick-or-treating. If there is no sidewalk and you need to walk on the street, keep to the left, next to the curb, and in single file facing (against) traffic.

- Children should be courteous and respectful of other people's property. Damaging or defacing property will not be tolerated.

- Parents should know who their children are with and which route they are taking through the area.

- Homeowners should leave outside porch lights on.
