

ORDINANCE NO. F- 1393

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE OFFICIAL MOTOR VEHICLE AND TRAFFIC SCHEDULES (Chapter 70) FOR THE CITY OF WHEATON, ILLINOIS PARKING

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and City Council of the City of Wheaton, Illinois, as follows:

SECTION 1: That the Official Motor Vehicle and Traffic Schedule (Customer Designated Parking) as referred in Section 70-356 of the Wheaton City Code, 1996, as amended, is hereby amended to read as follows:

(b) Customer designated parking shall include the following blocks: 100 block of North Main Street, East Front Street, East Liberty Drive (south side), West Liberty Drive; and 100 and 200 blocks of West Front Street; North Hale Street and West Wesley Street (expecting a two-hour limit for the south side of the 200 block of West Wesley between the parking garage alley and Wheaton Avenue); 200 block of West Liberty Drive (south side).

SECTION 2: That the Official Motor Vehicle and Traffic Schedule VIII. (Parking Time (non-metered) limited on certain streets and off street lots) as referred to in Section 7-354(e) of the Wheaton City Code, 1996, as amended, is hereby amended to read as follows:

(a) <u>4 Hr. Limit</u>	
(1) Cross Street	East Side from Front Street to Wesley Street.
(b) <u>2 Hr. Limit</u>	
(6) Liberty Drive	North side from Cross Street to Reber Street
(4) Cross Street	West side from Front Street to Wesley Street.
(2) Hale Street	Both sides from Illinois Street to Liberty Drive

SECTION 3. That all ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed.


SECTION 4: That this ordinance shall become effective from and after its passage, approval, and publication in a manner provided by law.
