

ORDINANCE NO. F-1395

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 26 (BUSINESSES), CHAPTER 54 (SOLID WASTE), CHAPTER 70 (TRAFFIC AND VEHICLES), CHAPTER 74 (UTILITIES), AND CHAPTER 82 (VEHICLES FOR HIRE) OF THE WHEATON CITY CODE

BE IT AND IT IS HEREBY ORDAINED by the Mayor and City Council of the City of Wheaton, Illinois, as follows:

Section 1: That Chapter 18 (Annexation), of the Wheaton City Code, 1996, is hereby further amended by deleting and replacing Section 18-5 (Fees, costs) with the following:

“Any petition for an annexation agreement or amendment thereto shall be accompanied by a fee of \$300.00. Any further extraordinary costs shall be borne by the petitioner.”

Section 2: That Chapter 26 (Businesses), Article II (Licensing), of the Wheaton City Code, 1996, is hereby further amended by deleting and replacing subparagraphs 18 (Refuse haulers) a. and b. of Section 26-36 (Fee schedule) with the following:

“(18) Refuse haulers:

- a. Commercial . . . \$400.00
- b. Multifamily . . . \$100.00

Section 3: That Chapter 26 (Businesses), Article II (Licensing), of the Wheaton City Code, 1996, is hereby further amended by deleting Section 26-38 (Proration) in its entirety.

Section 4: That Chapter 26 (Businesses), Article III (Burglar and Holdup Alarm Businesses), of the Wheaton City Code, 1996, is hereby further amended by deleting and replacing subparagraph (a) of Section 26-84 (Penalties; hearing.) with the following:

“(a) Fine for false alarm penalty. Any alarm user permittee who has more than three false alarms within a calendar year at a single protected location will be assessed fines according to the following fine schedule:

Commercial Alarms:

Fine per false alarm per calendar year

False alarms 1 through 3	No fee
False alarms 4 through 9	\$300.00
False alarms 10 through 14	\$600.00
False alarms 15 and over	\$1,000.00

Residential Alarms:

Fine per false alarm per calendar year

False alarms 1 through 3	No fee
False alarms 4 through 9	\$150.00
False alarms 10 through 14	\$250.00
False alarms 15 and over	\$350.00”

Section 5. That Chapter 54 (Solid Waste), Article II (Collection and Disposal), of the Wheaton City Code, 1996, is hereby further amended by deleting and replacing subparagraph (3) of Section 54-44 (Commercial, office, industrial, and institutional solid waste collection and disposal license) with the following:

“3. The fee for a commercial, office, industrial, and institutional solid waste collection and disposal license shall be \$400.00 per year.”

Section 6. That Chapter 70 (Traffic and Vehicles), Article II (Administration and Enforcement), of the Wheaton City Code, 1996, is hereby further amended by deleting and replacing Section 70-107 (Vehicles improperly parked in a leased parking space; towing and storage fees) with the following:

“Whenever a vehicle is towed by order of a police officer of this City for improperly parking in a leased parking space, the owner or operator may retrieve such vehicle upon payment of storage and towing fees computed as follows:

- (1) Towing fee: \$140.00
- (2) Storage fees are to be computed on the basis of \$30.00 per day, commencing on the day of the tow.”

Section 7. That Chapter 70 (Traffic and Vehicles), Article IV(Stopping, Standing and Parking), of the Wheaton City Code, 1996, is hereby further amended by deleting and replacing paragraph (a) of Section 70-415 (Application for parking authorization) with the following:

“(a) Application for leased parking authorization as provided in schedule X-D shall be made in writing upon forms furnished by the city clerk. Fees for leased parking under this section shall be in accordance with appendix B of this Code.

Section 8. That Chapter 74 (Utilities), Article VI (Water Service), Division 2 (Fees) of the Wheaton City Code, 1996, is hereby further amended by deleting and replacing paragraph (3) (Tap Fees) (a) (Water main taps) 3., third paragraph and paragraph (4) (Inspection fee) of Section 74-166 (Schedule of fees for connection to water-sewer system) with the following:

“Sewer taps over six inches shall be made by the builder under permit and direction of the city. The permit fee for such tap shall be \$75.00.”

Section 9. That Chapter 74 (Utilities), Article VI (Water Service), Division 2 (Fees) of the Wheaton City Code, 1996, is hereby further amended by deleting and replacing paragraph (3) (Tap Fees) (a) (Water main taps), subparagraph (4) (Inspection fee) of Section 74-166 (Schedule of fees for connection to water-sewer system) with the following:

“(4) Inspection fee. An inspection of water service from the curbstop to the house shall be required at the time of construction. The inspection fee shall be \$75.00.

An inspection of sewer service to the house shall be required at the time of construction. The inspection fee shall be \$75.00.”

Section 10. That Chapter 82 (Vehicles for Hire), Article VI (Wrecker or Towing Service Businesses), Division 2 (Fees) of the Wheaton City Code, 1996, is hereby further amended by deleting and replacing Section 82-189 (Fees; disposal of abandoned vehicles) with the following:

“(a) The following fees are hereby established for licensed wreckers:

Above fees to commence on the day of the tow and to include the day on which the vehicle is released.

The towing agency shall assume responsibility for abandoned vehicle disposal.

(8) Release fee (optional; applicable on Sunday, holidays, after noon on Saturday or at times other than normal business hours) \$50.00”

Section 11: That Appendix B (Fee Schedule), of the Wheaton City Code, 1996, is hereby further amended by deleting it in its entirety and replacing it with the following:
