Yard Waste Pickup Ends

Your final pickup for the season for yard waste (including leaves), food scraps and organic materials will be on your normal garbage day the week of Dec. 11. Please place items in biodegradable bags or containers no more than 35 gallons in size. Each bag or container must have a yard waste/organics sticker attached to be picked up.

Lakeshore Recycling Systems will resume its yard waste/food scrap/organic material collection during the first full week of April 2018.

First Phase of Downtown Construction Complete

Front Street improvements resume in spring

With the first phase of construction complete on Front Street, the City has reached an important checkpoint in the Downtown Streetscape project.

Initial construction involved digging below ground and replacing aging sanitary sewer pipes and water main. Crews worked on Front Street from West Street to Cross Street. While this phase required temporary lane closures and limited parking along Front Street, crews were able to complete the project on schedule and with at least one lane open for through traffic.

Snow Removal Reminders

As snowy weather arrives, the City of Wheaton has a few reminders that will help City crews to clear Wheaton streets and minimize safety hazards.

Plowing, blowing or shoveling snow into the roadway or across the street to the opposite parkway creates several problems. Snow that piles up in the street is a nuisance to other property owners, creates more narrow traffic lanes, and produces safety hazards for other drivers. It also can cause plows to hit the curb, which can damage the curb. For these reasons, the City enacted an ordinance that makes pushing snow into the street or onto an opposite parkway a violation of City Code. Please help keep our streets



safe by adhering to this ordinance. Violations yield a minimum fine of \$100 per day.

You can also help by keeping fire hydrants clear of snow and by removing obstructions – such as portable basketball hoops or decorative stone boulders – that are within 5 feet of the paved street. Please check your mailbox, too, to make sure it's not leaning into the roadway. Leaning

mailboxes become obstructions for snow plows.

Also, please remember that after 2 inches of accumulated snowfall, parking is prohibited on any street for 24 hours or until streets have been cleared.

Finally, please clear snow from sidewalks near your home. Keeping sidewalks clear, especially near intersections, is very helpful for children walking to school or their bus stops and other neighbors who use the sidewalks.

Keep the Wreath Red

This holiday season, the Wheaton Fire Department will decorate Wheaton's three fire stations with wreaths that have a special significance. The wreaths are part of the Keep the Wreath Red fire safety campaign, a statewide program that reminds you to practice fire safety during the holiday season. The wreaths feature red lights, and for each Wheaton fire caused by holiday decorations, the Fire Department will replace one red bulb with a white bulb.

Help the Fire Department Keep the Wreath Red by unplugging holiday lights before leaving home or sleeping, being careful with candles, using flame-retardant decorations, ensuring lights are in good condition and Underwriters Laboratories (UL) listed, and keeping trees watered.

Christmas Tree Recycling in Early January

The City's garbage/recycling hauler will pick up live Christmas trees for recycling on your collection day during the weeks of January 1, 2018, and January 8, 2018, at no charge, with no sticker needed. Please note that collection will be one day later for all pickups the week of January 1, 2018, due to the New Year's

Day holiday.

During this free two-week collection period, place your tree at the curb, and make sure trees are free of all decorations and are not in plastic bags. After the collection period, you will need to attach 1 garbage/organic sticker to a Christmas tree in order to have it collected.

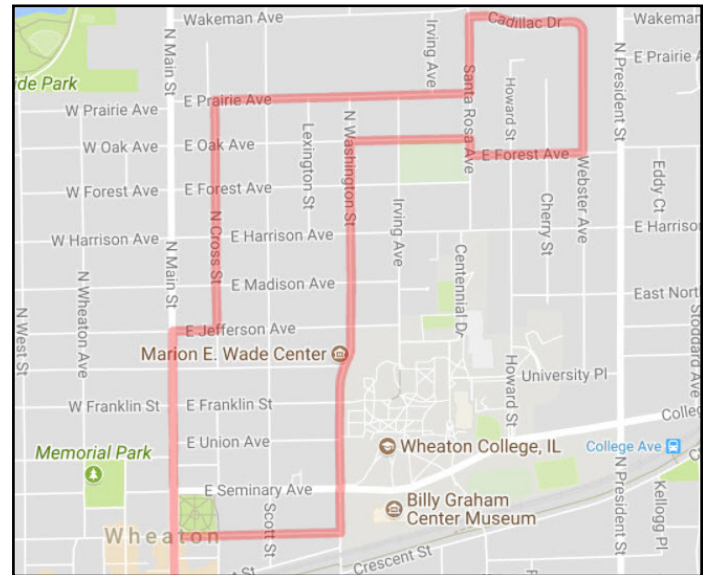
Road Closures for Reindeer Run

The Wheaton Lions Club / Wheaton Park District 5K Reindeer Run will be held on Saturday, Dec. 2, 2017, beginning at 8:30 a.m.

The following streets will be temporarily closed for this event:

- Main Street – between Front Street & Jefferson Avenue
- Jefferson Avenue – between Main Street & Cross Street
- Cross Street – between Jefferson Street & Prairie Avenue
- Prairie Avenue – between Cross Street & Santa Rosa Avenue
- Santa Rosa Avenue – between Prairie Avenue & Cadillac Drive
- Cadillac Drive – between Santa Rosa & Webster Avenue
- Webster Avenue – between Cadillac Drive & Forest Avenue
- Forest Avenue – between Webster Avenue & Santa Rosa Avenue
- Santa Rosa Avenue – between Forest Avenue & Oak Avenue
- Oak Avenue – between Santa Rosa Avenue & Washington Street
- Washington Street – between Oak Avenue & Wesley Street
- Wesley Street – between Washington Street & Main Street

- Oak Avenue – between Santa Rosa Avenue & Washington Street
- Washington Street – between Oak Avenue & Wesley Street
