Yard Waste/Food Scrap Collection Resumes

You can include much more than just yard waste through Wheaton's program

Residents served by Lakeshore Recycling Systems will have pickup for yard waste, food scraps and organic materials resume the week of April 2.

You can use containers no larger than 35 gallons in size or biodegradable paper bags. Each container or biodegradable bag must weigh no more than 50 pounds and must have one yard waste/organics/garbage sticker attached in order to be collected. All of the types of items below use the same type of sticker.

If containers are not feasible for yard waste, place brush and tree trimmings in stacks no longer than 4 feet in length and 18 inches in diameter. Stacks do not need to be bundled with twine, but each stack must have 1 garbage/yard waste sticker attached.

Reminder: It is illegal



to pile, blow or rake leaves onto the streets. Doing so can clog storm sewers, preventing them from working properly during a storm and possibly leading to flooding.

Items that can be included with your yard waste/organics collection:

Plants:

Floral trimmings
Tree trimmings
Leaves
Grass
Brush
Weeds

Foods:

Fruits & Vegetables
Meat
Poultry
Seafood
Shellfish
Bones
Rice
Beans
Pasta
Bread
Baked goods
Grains
Cheese
Eggshells

Other Compostable Items:

Waxed cardboard

Napkins
Paper towels
Paper plates
Pizza boxes
Food-contaminated paper (Example: fast-food bags)
Paper milk cartons
Tea bags
Coffee grounds/filters
Wooden crates
Sawdust

Do Not Include:

Grease
Cooking oil
Stickers on produce
Any sort of plastic
Polystyrene
Bottles
Cans
Aluminum foil
Liquids
Hazardous waste
Cleaning supplies
Rags
Wooden tools
Diapers or pet litter.
