New Neighborhood Speed Limit

Drive 25 in Wheaton neighborhoods

On July 16, the Wheaton City Council voted to lower the speed limit for City of Wheaton residential neighborhoods from 30 mph to 25 mph. The City is making this speed limit change to improve safety for the community.

The new speed limit goes into effect Aug. 1, before the new school year begins. The Public Works Department will be updating signs on City streets throughout August.

The City Council explored the process of lowering the speed limit based on a traffic study conducted by the engineering firm Kenin, Lindgren, O'Hara, Aboona, Inc. (KLOA).

While 25 mph will be the speed limit for the majority of residential

streets, there are some streets considered major collector and arterial streets, where traffic volumes exceed 6,000 cars per day. These streets serve as major access routes to and from Wheaton, and they will maintain their current speed limit.

Drivers and pedestrians will see new street signs, neighborhood yard signs, electronic

message boards and more in the coming weeks.

If you posted a "Drive 25" yard sign, we appreciate your support. Please place it on your property, not in the parkway. Typically, this means posting it behind the sidewalk (closer to your home).

Library Director Receives Award

Statewide honor recognizes service and leadership

Wheaton Public Library Director

Betsy Adamowski was recently named the 2018 Illinois Library Association (ILA) Librarian of the Year Award recipient. The award recognizes a librarian's distinguished service and leadership in Illinois libraries.

Among Adamowski's accomplishments noted by the Illinois Library Association are her work to improve the Wheaton Public Library, creating a business resource



center, a coffee shop, a 21st-century interior remodel vision plan, a community engagement department, and an arts and culture center. She has instituted numerous partnerships and is active in the Chamber of Commerce, Rotary and Lions Club. The Wheaton Chamber of Commerce

also recognized the Wheaton Public Library as its 2017 winner of the Large Business of the Year award.

The ILA also recognized Adamowski's leadership in the Illinois Library Association, serving as its president in 2015-16 and in a variety of leadership roles.

Have you ever wondered what it takes to become a firefighter? Are you interested in learning how the Wheaton Fire Department operates? The Wheaton Fire Department invites you to participate in a hands-on learning experience that will have you gearing up in fire equipment and learning what the life of a Wheaton firefighter is really like.

The Citizens Fire Academy is a 7-week course offered exclusively to Wheaton residents. The academy runs from 6:30-9:30 p.m. Tuesdays, Sept. 25 through Nov. 6. The program covers everything from day-to-day fire station operations, breathing apparatus, vehicle extrication, and much

more. The academy will culminate with the opportunity to extinguish a fire at the Carol Stream burn tower.

To take part in the Citizens Fire Academy, you must be a Wheaton resident who is at least 18 years old. Participants should plan to attend all seven weeks of the academy, as the information and skills learned will build upon prior sessions.

There is no fee to



participate in the Citizens Fire Academy and no minimum level of physical fitness required. Academy instructors will modify activities to meet individual abilities. The Wheaton Fire Department intends for the Citizens Fire Academy to represent a cross-section of the community, including a

wide range of ages and abilities.

Temporary Closures for Lot 9 Spaces

The City of Wheaton has temporarily closed some of the leased parking spaces in Commuter Parking Lot 9 due to construction on the City's adjacent Public Works Storage Yard. The spaces are needed to allow construction trucks and City trucks to access the construction site.

During this project, the City will be allowing Lot 9 lease holders to park in the daily fee parking spaces in Lot 9, which are along the west side of the parking lot. The project is anticipated to be completed by October.

The City encourages citizens who use the daily fee parking spots in Lot 9 to use metered parking along Carlton and Liberty or unmetered parking south of Childs Street.

This project will produce some dust and debris as trucks access the lot. We apologize for the inconvenience and appreciate your patience.

Location Change for August & September Electronic Recycling

Due to construction work at the Public Works Storage Yard, the City's monthly electronic drop-off on Aug. 11 will be moved to Commuter Parking Lot 9 at Carlton & Liberty.

The event usually takes place in the Public Works Storage Yard. Please note that the August event will ONLY accept electronics. You will not be able to drop off scrap metal, cooking oil or fluorescent tube bulbs at this particular pickup.

The September

August collection only for electronics

collection will be at the Green Fair from 10 a.m.-1 p.m. Sept. 15 at the DuPage County Fairgrounds, 2015 Manchester Road.

Another option is to take advantage of the curbside electronic recycling option available for Lakeshore Recycling Systems customers. To have your electronics collected at the curb on your garbage day, you must call Lakeshore Recycling Systems at 773-685-

8811 at least one day before your garbage day. Curbside collection requires the following number of stickers:

- E-Waste single item: 1 sticker = \$2.81
- E-Waste bundle (within brown paper bag): 5 stickers = \$14.05
- E-Waste TV or computer monitor: 10 stickers = \$28.10
