Municipal Election Takes Place on Tuesday, April 2

Early Voting & Grace Period Registration Now Available

Registered Wheaton voters can weigh in with their choice for Wheaton Mayor and two At-Large positions on the Wheaton City Council during the April 2, 2019 Consolidated Election. This election will also include Park District Board and School Board positions.

The DuPage County Clerk's Election Division opened Early Voting on Thursday, Feb. 21 at the DuPage County Election Division. Voting takes place at the DuPage County Administration Building, 421 N County Farm Road, Wheaton, on the first floor, Room 1-600.

If you have changed your name or address, you can update your voter's registration by Tuesday,



March 5 at Wheaton City Hall, or by utilizing Grace Period Voting Registration at the DuPage County Election Division. Two forms of identification are needed to register to vote; at least one form must display your current residential address.

Grace Period Registration & Voting:

Grace Period Voting will begin at the DuPage County Election Division, Room 1-600 on March 6.

The categories for nominees are: high school student, adult and group. A nominee must be a current Wheaton resident who has done something for the benefit of Wheaton and its citizens.



Wheaton Event Offers Paper Shredding, Syringe Collection and Paint Recycling

The City of Wheaton and Wheaton's Environmental Improvement Commission are partnering with the DuPage County Sheriff's Office, DuPage County and SCARCE to offer an opportunity for DuPage County residents to safely dispose of many materials at an upcoming event.

From 9 a.m. to noon on Saturday, April 6, in the City's Commuter Lot 9 (located at Carlton & Liberty Drive), the DuPage County Sheriff's office will assist in offering the first collection event in DuPage County for syringes and epipens. Collecting syringes helps keep them out of landfills, and out of the hands of people who may reuse syringes for drug use. This event will collect any type of syringe for safe disposal – including those used for pets. Syringes



must be brought in a plastic container, such as a laundry detergent bottle. Syringes will be collected whether they are empty or filled with medication.

You can also safely dispose of documents with sensitive information. Three shredding trucks will be available on-site for residents who want their documents shredded and safely disposed. Bring up to 3 office-sized boxes of documents, and be sure to remove things such as binders, report covers, file folders, photos, rubber

bands and plastic bags.

This event will also collect mercury thermometers, thermostats and barometers for safe disposal.

In addition, E-Paint will

collect oil-based and latex paint for a fee. Disposal of latex paint will cost \$1 per quart, \$3 per gallon, and \$10 per 5-gallon pail. Disposal of oil-based paint and stains will cost \$4 per quart, \$8 per gallon, and \$20 per 5-gallon pail. Oil-based paint can be accepted even if it appears dried out.

This event is being funded in part by the DuPage County Sheriff's Office and DuPage County.

This is a drive-up event. Please use the entrance to Lot 9 from Carlton Avenue.

Yard Waste Pickup Resumes Week of April 1

Yard waste, food scraps and organic materials are collected at the curb from the first full week of April through the second full week of December. Please do not place yard waste at the curb before the week of April 1, as Lakeshore Recycling Systems can't accept these materials before the pickup

season begins.

Use containers no larger than 35 gallons in size or biodegradable paper bags. Each container/bag must weigh no more than 50 pounds and must have one Lakeshore Recycling Systems sticker attached to be collected. For more about yard waste, visit the City's website.

Police & Fire Dept. Preparing for March 26 Exercise

While Wheaton students are on spring break, Wheaton's Police and Fire Departments will be busy taking part in a training exercise with Community Unit School District 200 staff, DuPage County Emergency Management, and Northwestern Medicine Central DuPage Hospital. Officials from the City have been working with these partners for months in advance of training, administered by the DuPage County Emergency Management staff.

The exercise will take place at Wheaton North High School and Wheaton Warrenville South High School on March 26, simulating the response of local agencies to an active

shooter incident. During the March 26 event, there will be many emergency vehicles in the vicinity of Wheaton North High School, but you should not be alarmed. Wheaton's Police and Fire personnel are using this as a tactical training exercise to practice their emergency response training, while District 200 staff and administration will practice their emergency response procedures and reunification plan using volunteers, who will be bussed to a second location.

"While Wheaton's Police, Fire and EMS personnel are consistently training for all types of incidents, it is very beneficial to hold exercises like this, where we can practice together with our community partners," said



Fire Chief Bill Schultz and the Wheaton Fire & Police Departments have met with District 200 staff in preparation for the exercise.

Police Chief Bill Murphy. "The City of Wheaton and District 200 take school safety very seriously, and drills like this help us to work through our response plans and be ready for any type of emergency that we may face."

This exercise will focus on not just the immediate response to the incident,

but also practicing the plans District 200 has in place to efficiently move students to a second location and reunify them with their parents.

Northwestern Medicine Central DuPage Hospital will also be participating in a coordinated exercise to practice its response to an active shooter incident.

IEMA Spreads Earthquake Preparedness Information

Drop, cover & hold on

Earthquakes aren't likely to be at the top of most people's minds in this region. However, Illinois is flanked on its western and

eastern borders by two active seismic zones: the New Madrid Seismic Zone and the Wabash Valley Seismic Zone. The Illinois Emergency Management Agency encourages people to learn how to "Drop,

Cover and Hold On," which helps prevent injuries during an earthquake. The phrase reminds you to drop down to the floor, take cover under a sturdy desk, table or other furniture, and hold on to that object and

be prepared to move with it until the shaking ends.

Most casualties result from falling objects and debris caused by the earth shaking. For more information, [visit IEMA's website](#).
