Municipal Election is April 2

Registered Wheaton voters can weigh in with their choice for Wheaton Mayor and two At-Large positions on the Wheaton City Council during the April 2 Consolidated Election. This election will also include Park District Board and School Board positions. Polls are open from 6 a.m. to 7 p.m. on Tuesday, April 2.

If you have changed your name or address, you can use Grace Period Voting Registration at the DuPage County Election Division, 421 N County Farm Road. Two forms of identification are needed to register to vote; at least one form must display your current residential address.

Yard Waste Collection Program Resumes the Week of April 1

Food scrap program also returns

Residents served by Lakeshore Recycling Systems will have pickup for yard waste, food scraps and organic materials resume the week of April 1.

You can use containers no larger than 35 gallons in size or biodegradable paper bags. Each container or biodegradable bag must weigh no more than 50 pounds and must have one yard waste/organics/garbage sticker attached in order to be collected.

In addition to grass clippings, tree trimmings, weeds and other plant materials, you can also include food scraps in with your yard waste. Just be sure you do NOT include grease, cooking oil, any sort of plastic, wooden tools, liquids,

rags, cleaning supplies, pet litter, stickers on produce, bottles, or cans. For more information, see the City's website at www.wheaton.il.us.

If containers are not feasible for yard waste, place brush and tree trimmings in stacks no longer than 4 feet in length and 18 inches in diameter. Stacks do not need to be bundled with twine, but each stack must have 1 garbage/yard waste sticker attached.

Reminder: It is illegal to pile, blow or rake leaves or grass clippings onto the streets. Doing so can clog storm sewers, preventing them from working properly during a storm and possibly leading to flooding.

Recycling Event Collects Syringes, Documents & More

The City and Wheaton's Environmental Improvement Commission are partnering with the DuPage County Sheriff's Office, DuPage County and SCARCE to offer an opportunity for DuPage County residents to safely dispose of these materials at an upcoming Recycling Extravaganza:

- Syringes & epi-pens
- Documents for shredding (limit 3 boxes)
- Mercury thermometers, thermostats and barometers
- Latex & oil-based paint (see fees below)

From 9 a.m. to noon on Saturday, April 6, in Commuter Lot 9 (Carlton & Liberty Drive; enter from Carlton), the DuPage County Sheriff's office will assist in offering the first collection event in DuPage County for syringes and epi-pens. Collecting syringes helps keep them out of landfills, and out of the hands of people who may reuse

syringes for drug use. This event will collect any type of syringe for safe disposal. Syringes must be brought in a plastic container, such as a laundry detergent bottle.

You can also safely dispose of documents with sensitive information. Shredding trucks will be available on-site for residents who want their documents shredded and safely disposed. Bring up to 3 office-sized boxes of documents. Remove binders, report covers, file folders, photos, rubber bands and all plastic.

E-Paint will collect oil-based and latex paint for a fee. Disposal of latex paint will cost \$1 per quart, \$3 per gallon, and \$10 per 5-gallon pail. Disposal of oil-based paint and stains will cost \$4 per quart, \$8 per gallon, and \$20 per 5-gallon pail.

This event is being funded in part by the DuPage County Sheriff's Office and DuPage County.

Native Plant Sale is April 27

Wheaton's annual native plant sale will take place Saturday, April 27, from 8:30 a.m. to 11 a.m. at the City's Public Works Department Facility, 821 W Liberty Drive.

The City of Wheaton, Wheaton Environmental Improvement Commission, and the Wheaton Park District

encourage residents to plant native plants, because they do not require irrigation or fertilizer, are resistant to drought and insects, and will not harm or degrade native ecosystems.
