Community Encouraged to Attend Wheaton Police Town Hall on June 5




The Wheaton Police Department invites the community to attend a town hall panel discussion where members of the Police Department and community partners from Community Unit School District 200, DuPage County Health Department and DuPage County State's Attorney's Office will discuss a variety of topics affecting our community. The town hall will take place at 6:30 p.m. Wednesday, June 5, at the Wheaton Park District Community Center, 1777 S. Blanchard St.

Participants on the panel will include Wheaton

Police Chief Princeton Youker, District 200 Assistant Superintendent for Administrative Services Matt Biscan, DuPage County State's Attorney Bob Berlin and DuPage County Health Department Deputy Director of Behavioral Health Lori Carnahan. The panelists will discuss how they are addressing current issues related to community safety and health, such as school safety; mental health support; and recent changes in criminal justice laws. Following remarks by each of the participants, the panel will field questions from the community.

Wheaton Police Department Conducting Training Exercise Tuesday, June 4 at Franklin Middle School



From approximately 8 a.m. to 6 p.m. Tuesday, June 4, the Wheaton Police Department and Community Unit School District 200 staff will be conducting a joint training exercise at Franklin Middle School simulating a response to a critical incident. This exercise will include simulated gunfire. We are providing this notice so the community is not alarmed if they hear simulated gunfire and see a large police presence in this area during the training exercise. Signs will be posted in the area while training is in progress.

The Wheaton Police Department works closely with Community Unit School District 200 personnel on an ongoing basis to ensure operational readiness for emergency incidents. Training exercises such as this one offer an opportunity for all involved to practice their emergency plans.


residents and visitors alike and offers fresh flowers and produce, crafts, specialty foods, and much more.



Help Prevent Mosquito-Transmitted Diseases



Each year, the Wheaton Mosquito Abatement District (a separate government entity from the City of Wheaton) monitors the area for mosquito transmitted diseases with the Illinois Department of Health, DuPage County Health Department, Forest Preserve District of DuPage County, and Clarke Environmental Mosquito Management, Inc. (Clarke).

Under the authority of the Illinois Mosquito Abatement District, field technicians perform mosquito control activities on public and private properties for the control of mosquitoes and protection of public health. This includes adult mosquito population surveillance, larval site monitoring, biological control, and strategic use of EPA labeled and registered pesticide products, if necessary.

The West Nile virus (WNV) is spread through the bite of infected mosquitoes. In 2023, DuPage County recorded 16 human WNV cases, compared to 4 in 2022, 12 in 2021, and 4 in 2020. Symptoms are initially similar to the flu, with muscle weakness and disorientation.

Though most of those infected will have mild

symptoms or no symptoms at all, in some individuals, WNV can cause inflammation of the brain (encephalitis) and in severe cases, paralysis, coma or death. The disease is most serious – even fatal – in those with compromised immune systems and the elderly.

Individuals can take the following steps to protect themselves against infection and assist in the fight against West Nile Virus:

- If outdoors when mosquitoes are active, dress in light-colored, long-sleeved clothing, long pants, and socks during prime mosquito hours.
- Discard any outdoor container that might hold water.
- Residents should report neglected pools to Clarke by contacting 1-800-942-2555 or wmad@clarke.com.
- Keep grass cut short and shrubbery well-trimmed.
- Do not dump grass clippings into low lying areas that collect water after rainfall.
- Report dead birds on your property to the DuPage County Health Department by contacting 630-682-7400.

June is Pet Preparedness Month, and the Illinois Emergency Management Agency (IEMA) reminds pet owners of the importance of pet emergency kits in the event of a disaster or other unexpected event.

During an emergency, a well-organized family evacuation plan with your family pet is important to ensure safety for everyone. Do not leave your pets behind. If you are not home, you should have a plan in place for a neighbor, relative, or a

trusted friend to care for your pets with your preparedness kits until you can reunite at a safe location.

Items for your pet preparedness kit include:

- Non-perishable food and water
- Waste bags, cat litter
- Blanket/bedding and pet toys
- Leashes, harnesses, or carriers
- Medications and a first-aid kit
- Copies of medical records, including vaccination records

Narcan Takeaway Box Available at Wheaton Police Department

A new Narcan Takeaway Box, provided by the DuPage Recovery Oriented Systems of Care, is now available right inside the front door of the Wheaton Police Department, 900 W. Liberty Drive. The box is accessible 24/7, 365 days a year. The boxes of Narcan are free of charge, and you do not need to speak with a member of the department or provide any personal information. There are instructions on the packaging explaining how to administer Narcan.

Narcan is an over-the-counter drug, administered as a nasal spray, that reverses the effects of an opioid overdose.
