Photos and addresses will be shared on the City of Wheaton and Wheaton Park District Facebook pages for residents looking to drive by and enjoy the decorations in person.

All Wheaton residents, businesses, houses of worship and community organizations are invited to participate in this free, friendly competition — all themes and holidays welcome! Showcase your fun, creative, out-of-the-box decorating ideas in what has quickly become one of Wheaton's favorite holiday traditions. Awards will be given in three categories: Most Creative, People's Choice, and Mayor's Choice.

Judging will take place from Dec. 13-19. For Most Creative and Mayor's Choice categories, judges will

observe houses from 6-9 p.m. daily during this time. Photos of entries shared on the City of Wheaton and Wheaton Park District Facebook pages will be voted on by the public for the People's Choice award.

Winners will be announced Friday, Dec. 20 via social media and email. All winners will receive a commemorative prize and \$100 in local gift cards.

To be eligible, participants must be located within Wheaton city limits and/or Wheaton Park District boundaries as well as decorate their homes/businesses themselves (homes/businesses that are professionally decorated can be registered but will not be eligible to win). To recognize the efforts of new participants, winners from 2023 are not eligible to receive awards in 2024, but they are still encouraged to participate!

Holiday Light Recycling Program Returns to Wheaton



Keep your old holiday lights out of landfills by bringing them to Wheaton's holiday light recycling drop-off site at the Public Works Storage Facility (820 W. Liberty Drive) between 7 a.m. and 3:30 p.m. weekdays now through Friday, Jan. 17.

Bring strands of incandescent or LED lights in any condition. Look for signs directing you to the holiday light recycling area just inside the gate. This program is for light strings only. Please do not drop off lawn ornaments or other decorations, and

do not put lights in a bag or box.

Elgin Recycling, elginrecycling.com, will collect the lights, which will then be stripped and recycled for their copper and plastic parts. No materials will be shipped overseas

In addition to residents, the City also welcomes businesses, schools, and other organizations wanting to dispose of holiday lights to participate in the program. There is no limit as to how many lights you can drop off for recycling.

Decorate Safely: Help the Wheaton Fire Department Keep the Wreath Red



This December, the Wheaton Fire Department will decorate Wheaton's three fire stations with wreaths that have a special significance. The wreaths are part of

the Keep the Wreath Red fire safety campaign, a statewide program that reminds you to practice fire safety during the holiday season. The wreaths feature red lights, and for each Wheaton fire caused by holiday decorations, the Fire Department will replace one red bulb with a white bulb. Help the Wheaton Fire Department Keep the Wreath Red by unplugging holiday lights before leaving home or sleeping; being careful with candles; using non-flammable decorations; ensuring lights are in good condition and Underwriters Laboratories (UL) listed; and keeping trees watered.

shop smart and protect yourself while checking off your holiday list.

Here are some helpful tips to keep in mind this season:

- Cyber thieves will set up fake e-commerce sites. Prior to making a purchase, read reviews to hear what others say about the merchant. In addition, look for a physical location and any customer service information.
- Using a credit card is often recommended

over a debit card, as there are more consumer protections for credit cards.

- Be alert to the kinds of information being collected to complete your transaction. If the merchant is requesting more data than you feel comfortable sharing, cancel the transaction.
- Be sure to continuously check your bank accounts for any unauthorized activity.



Gary Avenue Improvement Project Update



Improvements to Gary Avenue between Harrison Avenue and Jewell Road continue moving forward, with utility relocation work scheduled for completion by the end of 2024.

The City will keep this roadway open to traffic throughout the winter. Weather permitting, roadway work is anticipated to begin in March 2025. This project will include the following improvements:

- complete roadway reconstruction
- widening the road at the intersection of Gary & Prairie Avenue to add a left turn lane at Prairie Avenue for northbound traffic

- installing a traffic signal at Gary Avenue & Prairie Avenue
- adding a striped crosswalk with pedestrian signals
- installing an off-street shared-use path
- extending the Winfield Creek culvert, and
- installing storm sewers.

Roadway work is scheduled to be completed in fall 2025. The City is working with the project contractor to minimize disruption to this area. We will continue to provide updates throughout this project. We appreciate your patience during these important infrastructure improvements.

More Customer Parking Available for Holidays at Wheaton Place Garage



To ensure residents and visitors can enjoy holiday shopping, dining and more in the downtown, customer parking is available on all levels of the Wheaton Place Garage (232 W. Wesley St.) now through Monday, Dec. 30.

Other available customer parking includes:


- Ground floor of the Willow Avenue Garage, located at Willow and Cross Street (just south

of the railroad tracks)

- Lot 2, on the south side of Wesley between Main and Hale Street
- On-street customer parking spots throughout the downtown

On nights and weekends, the City Hall parking lot at 303 W. Wesley St. is also available for customer parking.

Update to City Zoom Meeting Format



The City recently updated the format for attending City Council meetings remotely to increase the online security of its meetings. If you'd like to attend the meeting using a computer, smartphone or other device, you will now find a registration link to the meeting you'd like to attend on the meeting agenda. Upon registering for the meeting, you will automatically receive a confirmation email from Zoom containing a link to attend the meeting. Please note that it may take several minutes for your email service to deliver this automatically generated email. Participants who wish to attend by phone will continue to find the number to call along with the meeting ID and passcode to attend on the meeting agenda.

Water Rate Changes Approved to Support Necessary Infrastructure Projects



The Wheaton City Council has approved changes to the City's water rates to address aging water infrastructure, significant increases in the amount the City pays to purchase water, and rising expenses to operate the City's water system. These changes implement the recommendations of the [Wheaton Water Rate Study](#), which includes the first adjustments to the City's water rates in 9 years, and annual adjustments to the rate that directly reflect how

much the City pays to purchase water from the DuPage Water Commission. These changes will begin with water customers' January 2025 utility bill. The impact on a customer's monthly water bill will vary based on their water meter size and consumption levels, however the average water customer is expected to see a monthly increase of approximately \$6.82 in 2025.
