Choose Your Garbage Cart Size

New garbage and recycling program starts Oct. 1

On Oct. 1, Lakeshore Recycling Systems will become Wheaton's new provider for garbage, yard waste and recycling collection. The new program continues to allow you to only pay for the amount of garbage, recycling and yard waste you create, but with some added conveniences and new technology.

Each household will receive a City-issued garbage cart to use alongside the City-issued recycling cart you already have. Lakeshore Recycling Systems will charge you a fee per pickup based on whether you select a 35-gallon, 65-gallon or 95-gallon garbage cart, and recycling pickups will be charged at a lower rate.

This means you no longer need to purchase garbage stickers for each bag or can. Instead, Lakeshore Recycling Systems' trucks will scan a chip embedded in your cart each time it is emptied,

allowing you to only pay for how many pickups per month you receive.

Wheaton's previous program included the costs related to recycling in the garbage/yard waste

sticker price. This program separates the costs of garbage and recycling service to correlate with how much garbage and recycling

you generate, but recycling is charged at a lower rate to encourage recycling.

Cost Comparison

For comparison, the current program's garbage stickers cost \$3.62 per bag/container (maximum 33 gallon size), which includes the price of recycling collection. A resident who now sets out one 33-gallon garbage can or one garbage bag per week and the standard 65-gallon recycling cart will pay \$2.60 per week with the new program (\$1.43 for 35-gallon garbage cart pick-up + \$1.17 for recycling), compared to \$3.62 with the current program.

How to Choose Your Cart

One key thing you should do before Sept. 8 is register with Lakeshore Recycling Systems and pick your garbage cart size.

In late August, Lakeshore Recycling Systems mailed you a postcard, and you will be receiving an informational brochure about the new program. Both items include a Verification Code for you to select your garbage cart size and register your household



online.

You can either: 1) choose your garbage cart online at <http://wheaton.rehrigtech.com>, or 2) mail back the tear-off postcard portion of the brochure that asks for your cart size choice.

If you'd like to see the 35-gallon, 65-gallon and 95-gallon carts before deciding which is best for you, sample carts are on display at City Hall, the Wheaton Public Library, the Community Center and several grocery stores in Wheaton.

Cart Delivery

Lakeshore Recycling Systems will deliver your garbage cart between

Sept. 15 and Oct. 1. You should begin using the garbage cart the week of Oct. 3. Your garbage day will not be changing with the new program.

You can keep your current garbage cans for home storage, or if you do not want them, Lakeshore will recycle them on your regular collection day. Clearly label the garbage can "please take" in order to have it recycled.

- Find the Verification Code on your postcard or brochure, listed in the address portion of the mailer under your name.
- Enter the code at <http://wheaton.rehrigtech.com>.
- Confirm your information and select from three sizes.

Garbage in cart will not require sticker

One of the benefits of Wheaton's new program is that you will no longer need to purchase garbage stickers for your normal trash. The new program will use Lakeshore Recycling Systems stickers only for extra garbage (in excess of what will fit in your cart), yard waste, organics (food scraps), leaves, bulk items, white goods and E-waste.

The City encourages you

not to purchase more Advanced Disposal garbage/yard waste stickers than you will need through the end of September. There will be a two-week grace period starting Oct. 1 in which you can use Advanced Disposal stickers – but you can only use them for excess garbage, yard waste, organics, leaves, bulk items, white goods and

E-waste.

You can receive a refund for excess Advanced Disposal stickers or trade them in for Lakeshore Recycling Systems stickers Sept. 19 through Oct. 14 at the Finance counter of City Hall. This will be available from 8:30 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday, Wednesday and Friday, and 8:30 a.m.-7 p.m. Tuesdays and Thursdays.

Election Candidate Petitions Available

Four Wheaton City Council positions will be up for election in April 2017

Petitions for candidacy for the 2017 Wheaton municipal election are now available in the Office of the City Clerk at Wheaton City Hall, 303 W. Wesley St. One four-year position for each of the City's four Districts (North, South, East, and West) is up for election. Candidates shall:

- Be registered voters of the City of Wheaton and candidates must reside within the corporate limits of the city at least one year next preceding the election; and
- File Nonpartisan Primary Petitions for Nomination signed by at least 25 registered City of Wheaton voters residing within the corporate limits of each specific district (North, South, East, and West) together with a Statement of Candidacy, Loyalty Oath (optional), and a receipt indicat-

ing the candidate has filed a Statement of Economic Interest with the DuPage County Clerk.

Petitions for nomination are filed with the Wheaton City Clerk, City Hall, 303 W. Wesley St., Second Floor, Wheaton, Illinois. The filing period is Monday, Nov. 21, 2016 through Monday, Nov. 28, 2016, 8 a.m. to 5 p.m., excluding weekend days and holidays. Note: City Hall offices are officially closed on Thursday, Nov. 24, and Friday, Nov. 25, 2016.



A Consolidated Primary election will be held on Tuesday, Feb. 28, 2017 if more than four candidates file for each district position (North, South, East, and West). The Consolidated Election will be held on Tuesday, April 4, 2017, with the successful candidates taking office at the latter of

either the first regular or special meeting after receipt of the official election results or at the first regular or special meeting in the month following their election.

Home Energy Assistance Program Accepting Applications

Eligible residents can receive help to pay heating bills through DuPage County's Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program this winter.

DuPage County Community Services will accept winter heating applications for the annual program from Sept. 1, 2016, until May 31, 2017, or until funds are depleted. Benefits are paid directly to the utilities on behalf of eligible households.

If your household's combined gross income for the 30

days beginning with the date of the application is at or below 150 percent of the federal poverty level, you may qualify for assistance. A single-person household can qualify for the program with a monthly gross income of up to \$1,485; a two-person household up to \$2,003; and a family of four can earn up to \$3,038.

Applications will be accepted in these phases:

• **Starting Sept. 1:** Seniors age 60 and older, people with disabilities, and households whose utilities (gas/electric)

have been disconnected

• **Starting Oct. 3:** All of the above groups, plus households with children age 5 and younger

• **Nov. 1:** All other eligible households can apply

The State of Illinois will be offering the Percentage of Income Payment Plan for the current program year. PIPP will be offered Sept. 1-Dec. 31, or until funds are exhausted.

You must bring the following required documentation when applying for assistance:

• Social Security Cards for

all household members;

- Proof of gross income from all household members for the 30 days prior to the date of application beginning with the date of application;

- Current heat and electric bills issued within the last 30 days (if you pay for the energy directly); and

- Rental agreement (if applicable) showing the monthly rental amount and the landlord contact information.
