Yard Waste Pickup Resumes

Starting on April 6, 2015, yard waste pickup in Wheaton resumes on your collection day. As a reminder, yard waste can be placed either in containers no larger than 33 gallons in volume or in biodegradable bags. Each container or bag needs a blue sticker – the same sticker that is used for garbage collection.

If containers are not feasible, brush and tree trimmings must be placed in stacks no longer than 4 feet in length and 18 inches in diameter. Stacks do not need to be bundled with twine but must have a garbage/yard waste sticker attached.

Things accepted:

1. Electronics: Anything with an on/off switch and all electric cords. Examples: TVs, computers, cell phones, printers, blenders, stereos, etc. Limit of two TVs and two monitors per car.

2. Scrap metal: Pots, swing sets, hangers, shelving, lawn furniture, tomato cages, drained lawn mowers, washers, dryers, etc.

3. Batteries: All household batteries, plus large batteries. Examples: AA batteries, car batteries, boat batteries, sump pump batteries

4. Fluorescent tube bulbs (No CFLs accepted)

5. Cooking oil

6. Bicycles: In any condition

7. Paper for on-site shredding. 3 box limit (letter/

legal paper-size box). Must remove rubber bands, binders, cardboard and plastic bags

8. Wheel chairs, eye glasses, hearing aids

9. Re-sellable building supplies for ReStore, such as gently used cabinets and plumbing supplies. No bricks or pavers accepted.

10. Miscellaneous: Buttons, rulers, LP records, musical instruments, keys, worn American flags

Do Not Bring:

- Refrigerators, freezers
- CFL light bulbs
- Hazardous waste
- Books (But books can be taken to SCARCE in Glen Ellyn for reuse and recycling. Visit www.scarce.org for information.)

Monthly Electronic Recycling Collections Returning Soon

Wheaton's monthly electronic recycling events will be returning soon – and better than ever.

The annual Recycling Extravaganza on April 11 will serve as a kick-off event for you to recycle your electronics, household appliances and much more. This event will be held in the commuter parking lot at Liberty Drive and Carlton Avenue. (See page 1 for information.)

Then, on May 9, the regular monthly electronic recycling events will resume, taking place from 9 a.m. to noon on the second Saturday of each month at the Public Works Storage Yard, [820 W. Liberty Drive](#) (near the Police Department).

New to the monthly events will be the collection of scrap metal and batteries of all types. As in the past, you can also bring cooking oil, fluorescent tube bulbs (no CFLs please) and many types of electronics.

These events accept almost anything with an on/off switch and a power cord, from computers, radios, DVD players and alarm clocks to blenders, extension cords, video cameras, hair dryers and cell phones. While TVs and monitors will be accepted, there is a limit of two plastic-cased televisions, projection televisions or console televisions per car. Tips to Avoid Online Tax Scams

It is tax season, which means it is also time for tax frauds, with numerous online frauds that attempt to steal people's tax refunds, bank accounts or identities. Last year, the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) estimates it paid \$5.2 billion in fraudulent identity theft refunds in filing season 2013. Websense Security Labs reported in 2014 it saw approximately 100,000 IRS-related frauds in circulation every two weeks.

This year, residents need to be especially careful in light of the Anthem Breach, in which data from approximately 80 million customers was exposed, triggering new phishing attacks offering false claims of credit monitoring services.

Users who have already filed their taxes this season can still be vulnerable to tax-related scams. Many schemes take advantage of users by alleging to have information about the filer's refund, or noting a problem with the return that was previously filed.

One scam that has already been impacting users this season involves phishing emails claiming to be from Intuit's TurboTax. The emails prompt users to click on links to verify their identity or update their accounts in an attempt to download malware to the

victim's machine, or steal data such as Social Security numbers or financial information.

Common email scams:

- **The email says the user is owed a refund** and should forward a bank account number where the refund may be deposited. Once the scammer has the bank account information, that account will see a big withdrawal, not a deposit.

- **The email contains exciting offers** or refunds for participating in an "IRS Survey." This fake survey is actually used to acquire information to perform identity theft.

- **The email threatens the user** with fines or jail time for not making an immediate payment or responding to the email.

- **The email includes a "helpful" downloadable document** (e.g. "new changes in the tax law," a tax calculator, etc.). In reality, the download is a malicious file intended to infect computers.

How to Avoid Becoming a Tax-Scam Victim:

Do not respond to emails appearing to be from the IRS. *The IRS does not initiate taxpayer communications*

through email or social media to request personal or financial information. If residents receive an unsolicited email claiming to be from the IRS, send it to phishing@irs.gov.

Do not respond to unsolicited emails and do not provide sensitive information via email. If the email appears to be from an employer, bank, broker, etc., contact the entity directly. Do not open any attachments or click on links contained in unsolicited or suspicious emails.

Carefully select the tax sites visited. Use caution when searching online for tax forms, advice on deductibles, tax preparers, and other similar topics. Do not visit a site by clicking on a link sent in an email, found on someone's blog, or in an advertisement. The website landed upon may look just like the real site, but it may be a well-crafted fake.

Secure all computers and Internet devices. Make sure all computers have all operating system and application software updates. Anti-virus and anti-spyware software should be installed, running and receiving automatic updates. Ensure use of a strong password and different passwords for each account.
