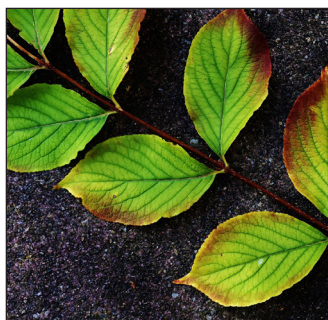
Employment Opportunities

Yard Waste Pickup and Food Scrap Composting Resume



Yard waste pickup is back starting the week of April 3. On your garbage day, you can place your yard waste at the curb either in biodegradable paper bags or in containers no more than 35 gallons in size. Each bag or container must have a Lakeshore Recycling Systems sticker attached.

In addition to grass

clippings, brush and other yard waste, you can also include food scraps with your yard waste for composting. This is a new feature of the garbage, yard waste and recycling collection offered by Lakeshore Recycling Systems, Wheaton's new waste hauler. [See the City's website](#) for more information.

Main Street Crossing Closed during Work

Temporary closure through April 7

Union Pacific is temporarily closing the railroad crossing at Main Street in downtown Wheaton to perform scheduled work on the crossing.

The temporary closure – which will last through approximately April 7 – is necessary to ensure continued safety along the Metra West line.

The detour route for northbound traffic on Main Street will be:

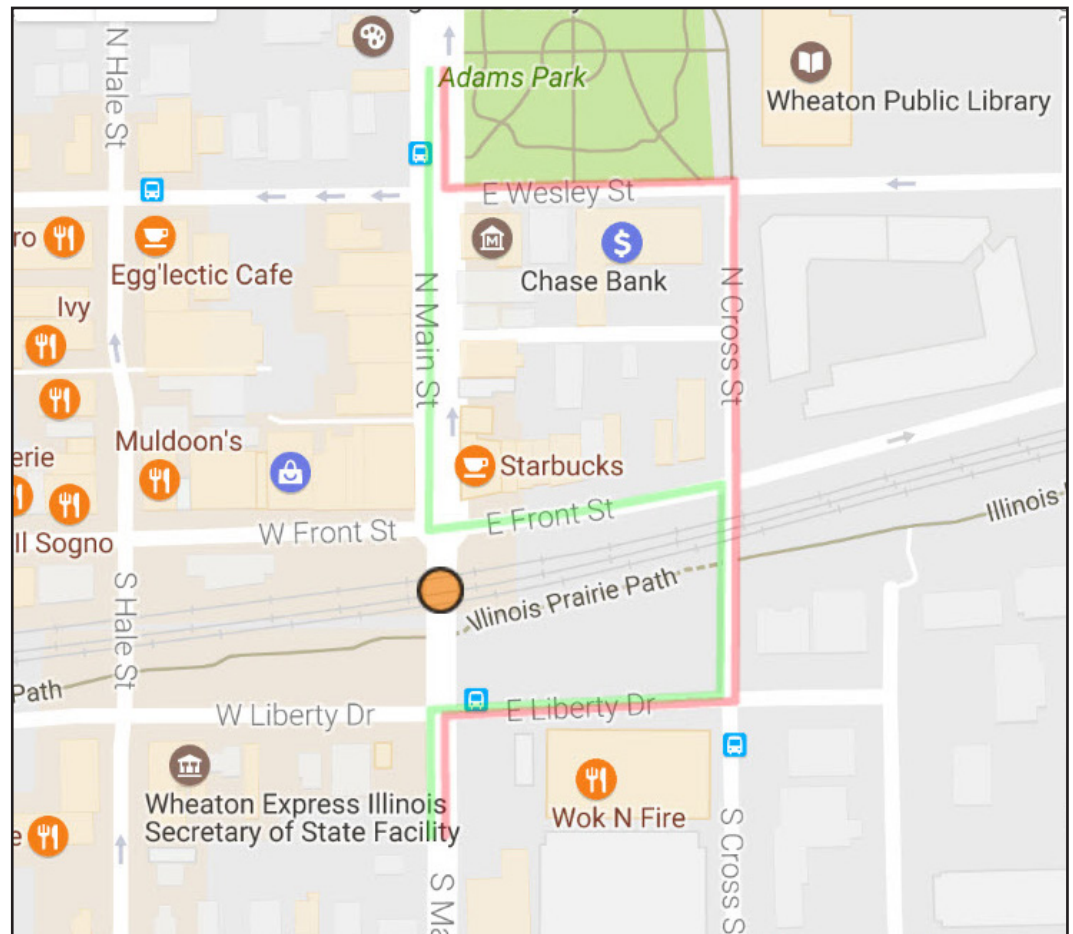
- East (right) on Liberty Drive
- North (left) on Cross Street
- West (left) on Wesley Street
- North (right) on Main Street

The detour route for southbound traffic on Main Street will be:

- East (left) on Front Street
- South (right) on Cross Street
- West (right) on Liberty Drive
- South (left) on Main Street

Detour signs will be in place at the crossing. For more information, please call 630-260-2190.

April 3 Meeting Will Discuss the First Phase of Downtown Streetscape Project

The City of Wheaton will host an informational meeting to discuss the schematic design drawings for Phase 1 of the downtown streetscape project on Monday, April 3 at 3 p.m. at Wheaton City Hall.

Members of the project team – including executive City staff, Primera Engineering and Design Workshop – will present the schematic design drawings and specifications to share

and receive feedback from interested business owners and residents.

Phase 1 of the downtown streetscape project features work on Front Street from West Street to Cross Street and will include infrastructure improvements, wayfinding signage, benches, trees and improved lighting.

Survey work and soil samples have been completed, and final drawings and specifications

are being created now through the summer months. Underground utility work is scheduled to begin this fall.

The meeting is open to the public and will take place in the City Hall Council Chambers (Second Floor) located at 303 W. Wesley St. in downtown Wheaton. A recorded broadcast of the meeting will air the following day on City of Wheaton Channel 10 and online at www.wheaton.il.us.

This event is a partnership between the City of Wheaton, Wheaton Environmental Commission and Wheaton Park District to promote environmentally friendly planting in the community.

Native plants are adapted to the soils and climate of our area. They're beneficial because they don't require irrigation or fertilizer, are resistant to drought and insects, will not harm or degrade native ecosystems,

and are beautiful and interesting.

You can also pre-order a rain barrel to pick up at the sale, or pick up free wood chips (bring your own container). To pre-order a rain barrel from the Conservation Foundation, call 630-428-4500.

Free Paper Shredding Offered April 8

The City's Environmental Improvement Commission will host a paper shredding event from 9 a.m.-1 p.m. Saturday, April 8, in the commuter parking lot at Carlton Avenue and

Liberty Drive. This is a drive-up event, and documents will be shredded on-site.

You must remove rubber bands, plastic page protectors, plastic bags, plastic file tabs and binders.

However, staples and paper clips do not need to be removed. Please note that there is a limit of 3 boxes for shredding (boxes should be the equivalent of standard copier paper/office boxes).
