Sidewalk Program Progresses

This summer the City began a pilot sidewalk replacement program to address some of the sidewalks in the city in the worst condition. This program is starting with the southeast portion of Wheaton. The program area is bounded by Naperville Road to the west, Roosevelt Road to the north, and the City's southern and eastern limits. In this area alone, the City identified more than 2,500 sidewalk squares that met the City's "highly defective definition" and need to be replaced.

Community Input Sought to Help Shape Downtown Plan

Share what you want Downtown Wheaton to be

Back in November 2011, the Wheaton City Council adopted four strategic priorities intended to guide the Council's and City staff's decisions and actions, one of which includes encouraging economic development. One way this is being implemented is by developing a [strategic plan for downtown Wheaton](#).

Representatives from the City and planning/urban design consultant Design Workshop kicked off a process to create this overall plan for downtown Wheaton with back-to-back meetings with the City Council and the public. Following a discussion during the City Council's June 25 Planning Session, the City invited the public to an initial meeting June 26 to explain the purpose of the Downtown Strategic Plan and Streetscape Plan and



how you can participate in the project. A significant component of the planning process is receiving community input.

At the June 26 public meeting, representatives from Design Workshop stated there are a number of issues and goals associated with the plan that will be addressed, including:

- Defining boundaries and gateways for the downtown area
- Connecting other parts of town to the downtown

What do you want Downtown Wheaton to be?

- Establishing a vision for downtown
- Developing a strategy to achieve the vision
- Developing a streetscape plan
- Integrating prior planning efforts

Watering Violations Ticketed

A dry summer has caused many residents to water their lawns more than in past years. However, please remember that watering restrictions remain in place through Sept. 15 in order to promote water conservation and minimize evaporation during the hottest part of the day. Watering violations can be ticketed by the Police Department.

Residents with odd-numbered street addresses can water their lawns on odd-numbered days and those



with even-numbered addresses are limited to even-numbered days. Sprinkling is prohibited between noon and 6 p.m. every day. Contact the Water Division at 630-260-2090 for a 10-day new sod/seed variance.

Design Workshop plans to have a community visioning session from 7-9 p.m. Tuesday, Sept. 18 at the DuPage County Historical Museum Auditorium, 102 E. Wesley St., during which the consultant will present their analysis of existing conditions and solicit

public input. After that, there will be a series of public meetings to present plan options, solicit feedback and eventually present the final plan. The entire project is scheduled to be completed by January 2013.

ComEd Offers Text Message Service Alerts



Last month's storms had many residents seeking information about electrical service outages and the status of restoration work. ComEd offers an Outage Alert program, through which you can receive text messages alerting you of estimated restoration times and other outage information affecting your ComEd service. There is no charge for this service, however message and data rates for your mobile service provider may apply. ComEd will send no more than

seven text messages in one day.

You can sign up for this service any time on [ComEd's website](#). You will need to know either the phone number on the ComEd account, the Social Security Number of the ComEd account holder or the ComEd account number. Once you are signed up for the Outage Alert program, you can report an outage by texting "OUT" to 26633.

This program is administered by AGENT511. You can cancel alerts at any time by texting "STOP" to 26633.
