## City Replacing Water Meters

*Long-term project expected to take 5 years to complete*

The City's Water Division soon will begin replacing the majority of the 16,500 water meters within the City as part of its multi-year Water Meter Replacement Program.

The current water meters have been in service for 10-15 years and have reached the end of their useful lives. As water meters age, they can lose accuracy, resulting in incorrect billing. The new meters, which have an expected 20-year battery life, will ensure accurate readings and billing.

The new water meters will operate the same as the old meters. All water meters in Wheaton currently have a wireless device that transmits the meter readings on a licensed radio frequency over a short distance to a handheld or mobile device. Readings are transmitted once a month, when a Water Division meter reader drives by each location to wirelessly collect water usage data from each meter. This technology has improved

the efficiency of the meter reading program.

This program is expected to take about 5 years to complete. When your water meter is set to be replaced, you will receive a letter from the City requesting a meter replacement appointment.

During this appointment, a Water Division customer service representative will visit

your home to replace the water meter, free of charge. Each appointment takes about 30 minutes to complete, during which the water will be shut off for approximately 15 minutes. Appointments may be scheduled between the hours of 7:30 a.m. and 4 p.m., Monday through Friday.

## Results of Police Department's "Click It or Ticket" Campaign

The Wheaton Police Department participated in a statewide "Click It or Ticket" campaign by conducting 37 "Occupant Protection Enforcement Zones" from June 23, 2014 through July 6, 2014.

Officers issued 263 tickets for not wearing a seat belt, 15 tickets for not securing a child in a safety seat, and 41 tickets for talking on a cellular telephone while driving.

The City of Wheaton received an Illinois Department of Transportation grant to

fund this holiday enforcement effort. The goal was to boost the state's safety belt use rate, and reduce fatalities and injuries.

Safety belt use is important for all motor vehicle occupants. Motor vehicle crashes in the United States are the leading cause of death for ages 5 to 24. The Wheaton Police Department wants all motorists and passengers know that they are more at risk of suffering a serious injury or death should they choose not to buckle up.

## Program for E-waste Drop-off to be Suspended

Following the [Aug. 9 electronic recycling collection](#), the City will be suspending its monthly electronic drop-off program until further notice. The vendor the City previously used is no longer able to provide this service.

After the August event, residents still have several options for recycling their electronics properly.

Advanced Disposal, the City's garbage/recycling hauler, will accept electronics curbside if you call 630-587-8282 at least one day before your garbage day to request a pickup. A separate truck comes by to pick up electronics only when requested. Each large item (such as a television) requires one garbage sticker, but smaller items (i.e. cell phone, camera, network cable and a keyboard) can be bundled, up to 4 items, with one sticker.

A number of stores, non-profit organizations and recycling locations will also accept electronics for recycling. Please see [this information regarding locations accepting various electronics](#).

The City is working to arrange a collection event that will take place in October. Information will be posted on the City's website and sent to [Email Updates subscribers](#) once details are available.

## County Farm Road Resurfacing Begins Soon

As part of a DuPage County project to resurface various County highways, crews will be working on County Farm Road from Roosevelt Road to Jewell Road.

Work is currently scheduled to begin the week of Aug. 4 and extending through the end of September.

Crews anticipate temporary lane closures, but no permanent lane closures are planned. The contractor will be restricted from blocking lanes before 8:30 a.m. and after 4 p.m. Monday through Friday. Crews will maintain access to adjacent properties during construction.

This project will include

milling and resurfacing County Farm Road, and may also include improvements such as pavement patching, curb and gutter repairs, sidewalk replacement and drainage structure adjustments. The goal of this program is to extend the road's existing service life and improve rideability.

## Attend County Event, Take Watershed Survey

Residents whose properties fall within Spring Brook #1 watershed can attend an upcoming educational event and participate in a survey. Much of Wheaton falls within the Spring Brook #1 watershed, which is an area in which all of the precipitation and groundwater drains into a single larger body of water. The Spring Brook #1 watershed also includes portions of Warrenville and Glen Ellyn. [See this map to find out if your property falls within Spring Brook #1 watershed.](#)

DuPage County Stormwater Management, the Forest Preserve District of DuPage County and several other partners will present the "What's in Your Watershed?" event from 11 a.m.-3 p.m. Saturday, Aug. 2, 2014 at the Urban Stream Research Center in Blackwell Forest Preserve. The purpose of the event is to familiarize property owners with the Spring Brook #1 watershed, and demonstrate how to protect DuPage County's waterways both at home



and work. Learn how small changes to everyday habits can help reduce pollutants in stormwater runoff. DuPage County Stormwater Management staff will also discuss how you can become more involved in protecting and enhancing the local Spring Brook #1 watershed.

Property owners within the Spring Brook #1 watershed can also take an online survey at [www.surveymonkey.com/s/SpringBrookWatershed](http://www.surveymonkey.com/s/SpringBrookWatershed) to enable the County to learn more about the watershed. This includes areas of repeated flooding, streambed erosion, polluted stormwa-

ter runoff, unlawful discharge and other potential water quality impairments. County staff and other stakeholders will use this information to develop projects and initiatives throughout the watershed. The survey will be open through Aug. 15.
