New Garbage Program for Wheaton Begins Oct. 1

Residents Encouraged Not to Purchase Excess Stickers

Starting Oct. 1, Wheaton's garbage and recycling program will see some significant changes of which all residents need to be aware. That is the date that Wheaton's new garbage/yard waste/recycling program starts, using a new waste hauler, Lakeshore Recycling Systems.

New Technology

The new program will mark a significant change in the way you pay for garbage, recycling and yard waste service. Instead of using garbage stickers – which also currently include the cost of recycling service – Lakeshore Recycling Systems will use a technology called Radio Frequency Identification (RFID) to charge a household's customer account each time their garbage or recycling cart are emptied. Stickers will only be used for garbage that does not fit in the selected cart, yard waste/organics, bulk waste, electronic

items and white goods.

RFID technology is similar to a car's iPass device, which charges your account every time you pass through a toll station, communicating wirelessly with the receiver in your car. Similarly, each garbage and recycling cart will have an RFID tag attached to it that is linked to your household's account. Each time a garbage/recycling truck empties your cart, it charges a "tipping fee" to

the household account.

Garbage Carts

The program will require you to use a standard City-issued garbage cart, similar to the blue recycling cart that you currently use. You will have the option of several different garbage cart sizes, so you can select the option that best fits your needs. Lakeshore Recycling Systems will reuse your current

recycling cart and will attach an RFID tag to it.

Fees

One of the most significant changes will be that the cost of recycling will no longer be included in garbage sticker fees. Because recycling collection currently does not require a sticker, many residents mistakenly believe that it is “free” to recycle in Wheaton. In reality, the cost of recycling service was figured into the cost of garbage stickers.

The new program will charge separate tipping fees for garbage and recycling carts. Recycling tipping fees are charged at a lower rate, which will continue to encourage recycling.

Yard waste, leaves, electronics, excess garbage and



bulk items will continue to use stickers.

Food Scrap Collection

The new program will also include an option for curbside food scrap collection. This is an optional program through which residents can include food scraps with their yard waste. Lakeshore Recycling Systems will provide more information for residents interested in this service.

Current Stickers

While there will be a two-

What Do I Need to Do?

Before this program begins, you will need to:

- 1) Select the size garbage cart you would like to use, and
- 2) Set up a household account with Lakeshore Recycling Systems for billing.

Look for information coming in mid-August from the City and Lakeshore Recycling Systems instructing you on how to do this online, by mail or by phone.

week “grace” period starting Oct. 1, where you can use the current vendor's stickers on yard waste or disposal of specialty items (electronics/bulk/etc.), the City encourages you to plan ahead regarding the current vendor's garbage stickers. Do not purchase a large quantity of garbage/

yard waste/leaf stickers as the current program ends. The City will offer a trade-in period from Sept. 19 through Oct. 14 where you can either exchange your current stickers for Lakeshore's yard waste/leaf/electronic recycling/bulk item stickers, or receive a refund for the stickers.

Take Part in the Citizens Fire Academy

Seven-week course open to Wheaton residents 18 and older

If you've ever wondered what it takes to be a firefighter, the Wheaton Fire Department invites you to participate in a hands-on learning experience that will have you gearing up in fire equipment and seeing what the life of a Wheaton firefighter is really like.

The Citizens Fire Academy is a 7-week course from 6:30-9 p.m. Tuesdays, Sept. 27 through Nov. 8, 2016, covering everything from day-to-day fire station operations to breathing apparatus, vehicle extrication and much more. Sessions will take place at Wheaton Fire Station One, 1 Fapp Circle. The academy will culminate with an exercise



putting out a fire in the Carol Stream burn tower.

To take part in the Citizens Fire Academy, you must be a Wheaton resident who is at

least 18 years old. You should plan to attend all seven weeks of this session, as the information and skills learned will build upon the prior sessions.

Electronic Recycling Monthly Collections Now Charge for TVs

A new vendor, eWorks Electronic Services Inc., is now providing electronic recycling monthly collections in Wheaton. Residents can drop off electronics from 9 a.m. to noon on the second Saturday of each month at the Public Works Storage Yard, 820 W. Liberty Drive.

The biggest change to this program is a charge for recycling all TVs and monitors. TVs/monitors with screens less than 21 inches cost \$25 per item to recycle, and those with screens 21 inches or more cost \$35 per item to recycle. eWorks Electronic Services Inc. accepts cash or credit card payments at the drop-off.

Items accepted include:

- computers and computer equipment (such as PCs, modems, keyboards, scanners and cables),
- office equipment (such as telephones, copy machines, cell phones),
- home entertainment systems (such as video game systems, cameras)
- small home appliances (such as microwaves, hair dryers, blenders, power tools)
- cooking oil (for recycling into biofuel)
- fluorescent tube lights (no CFL light bulbs)
- scrap metal.

Items not accepted include large appliances, and hazardous and chemical waste. If you have questions, contact eWorks Electronic Services Inc. at 847-276-8894.
