Yard Waste Pickup Ends Soon

Yard waste/food scraps/organics collection in Wheaton will end the week of Dec. 12-16, with your last pickup being on your regular garbage day.

For leaf pickup, place leaves in containers 33 gallons in size or smaller, or in biodegradable bags. Containers or bags must weigh less than 50 pounds when filled. Each container or bag requires a Lakeshore Recycling Systems sticker, which is available at City Hall, 303 W. Wesley St., and at many local grocery and hardware stores. Holiday Garbage Pickup Schedules

Lakeshore Recycling Systems will observe the Christmas Day and New Year's Day holidays on Monday, Dec. 26 and Monday, Jan. 2, respectively, and will not collect garbage/yard waste/recycling on these days. All pickups for the weeks of Dec. 26 and Jan. 2 will be one day later than usual.

Look for Your First Garbage & Recycling Bill in the Mail

Information on payment options also included with invoice

Be on the lookout for your first invoice for garbage and recycling service.

Lakeshore Recycling Systems began mailing invoices for garbage and recycling pickup service you have received since the new program began on Oct. 1. Invoices are being mailed in groups, and all residents served by Lakeshore should receive their invoice by mid-December.

Along with your invoice, you will also receive information about your payment options, how to set up your customer account online, and how to make a payment. The enclosed information also includes



answers to frequently asked questions about Lakeshore's billing system.

Please note that you must wait until you have received your mailed invoice before you can make a payment. The invoice includes your Customer

Account Number and Invoice Number, which you will need in order to set up your customer account.

Christmas Tree Recycling

Christmas trees will be collected as part of curbside recycling the weeks of Jan. 2 and Jan. 9 on your garbage/recycling day. (Note that your pickup day will be one day later during the week of Jan. 2 due to the observed holiday). Lakeshore Recycling Systems will recycle your tree without a sticker during these weeks.

Remove all decorations, including tinsel or garland, and place your tree at the curb on your regular garbage pickup day. Please do not place your tree in a bag.

If you miss the two-week collection period, you will need to put the tree at the curb with five Lakeshore stickers.

Christmas Light Recycling

From now through Feb.



10, 2017, you can bring strands of incandescent or LED lights and extension cords in any condition to the Public Works Storage Facility at 820 W. Liberty Drive (across from the Public Works facility) any time between 8 a.m. and 4 p.m. on weekdays.

Look for signs directing you to the holiday light recycling area just inside the gate.

Please do not place your lights in a plastic bag, and do not include lawn ornaments or other decorations.

Elgin Recycling will collect the lights, which will then be stripped and recycled for their copper and plastic parts. No materials will be shipped overseas.

Commission News

The City Council reappointed Don Westlake to the Band Commission, appointed Gail Forrest to the Community Relations Commission, appointed Brittany Drummond to the Environmental Improvement Commission, reappointed Tracy Jones to the Wheaton Downtown Design Review Board, and reappointed Steph McGrath to the Historic Commission. Each will serve three-year terms.

Three City Commissions Seek New Members

More than 100 Wheaton residents volunteer their time to serve on City boards and commissions, which help improve communication between the City and residents. These groups meet on a regular basis to review specialized matters, develop recommendations to the City Council, and/or plan programs and events benefitting the community. Three commissions are seeking new members.

The **Wheaton Housing Commission** administers a Housing Assistance Program to assist Wheaton seniors with their housing costs.

The **Wheaton's Police Pension Fund Board**'s duties include investing funds, enforcing contributions, keeping records of the

board's meetings and other duties related to managing the Police Pension Fund.

The **Group Care Home Commission** reviews all applications for group care homes that do not have a license from a federal, state or county agency; and reviews requests for group care home license renewals.

Filing an Objection:
Objections to nomination

petitions may be filed within five business days following the last day of filing – Nov. 29, 2016 through Dec. 5, 2016 – between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m.

Filing a Withdrawal:
Any candidate who has filed a nomination petition may cause his/her name to be withdrawn up to Dec. 21, 2016, between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m.

Learn How You Can Prevent Frozen Pipes This Winter

Do you know how to prevent water pipes in your home from freezing or how to thaw them if they do freeze? A few tips can save you the hassle of dealing with frozen pipes.

- Insulate pipes in unheated areas or against outside walls and seal any leaks that may let cold air in.
- Keep your garage door closed if your water meter is

located in that area.

- Disconnect your garden hose and shut off the water supply to outside faucets.
- If the temperature gets extremely cold, open cabinet doors under sinks to allow heat to get to pipes and let a faucet drip at a trickle if possible.

Snow Removal Reminders

Help snow plows by not parking on the street and clearing obstructions

As snowy weather arrives, the City of Wheaton has a few reminders that will help City crews to clear Wheaton streets and minimize safety hazards.

Plowing, blowing or shoveling snow into the roadway or across the street to the opposite parkway creates several problems. Snow that piles up in the street is a nuisance to other property owners, creates more narrow traffic lanes, and produces safety hazards for other drivers. It also can cause plows to hit the curb, which can damage the curb. For these reasons, the City enacted an ordinance that makes pushing snow into the street or onto an opposite parkway a violation of City Code. Please help keep our streets safe by adhering to this ordinance. Violations yield a minimum fine of \$100 per day.

You can also help by keeping fire hydrants clear of snow and by removing obstructions – such as portable basketball hoops or decorative stone boulders – that are within 5 feet of the



Please check to make sure your mailbox isn't damaged or leaning into the street, and move portable basketball hoops and other items that are within 5 feet of the curb. These become obstructions for snow plow drivers that are trying to clear your street.

paved street. Please check your mailbox, too, to make sure it's not leaning into the roadway. Leaning mailboxes become obstructions for snow plows.

Also, please remember that after 2 inches of accumulated snowfall, parking is prohibited on any street for 24 hours or until streets have been cleared.

Finally, please clear snow from sidewalks near your home. Keeping sidewalks clear, especially near inter-



sections, is very helpful for children walking to school or their bus stops and other neighbors who use the sidewalks.
