## Give Input for Adams Park Plan

*City Seeks Feedback to Create Master Landscape Plan*

Adams Park landscaping design options will be displayed and available for public comment at the Concert in the Park sponsored by the Wheaton Public Library on June 19.

The City engaged the services of Upland Design to develop a

landscaping design to guide the maintenance and care of Adams Park. As part of this process, [a survey seeking public comment regarding Adams Park](#) has been available on the City's website since early May. More than 600 responses were received. Additionally,

the City hosted two public meetings to allow residents to discuss the history, existing conditions and future needs of the park.

## Lecture: Wheaton, IL – Golf History Starts Here

**Date:** June 5

**Time:** 7 p.m.

**Location:** Wheaton Public Library, 225 N Cross Street

Nancy Flannery, chair of Wheaton's Historic Commission, will give a lecture on Wheaton's significance to the development of golf in the U.S. The history of golf in the United States had some of its early beginnings here in Wheaton.

Not only was the first 18-hole golf course in the country built in Wheaton (The Chicago Golf Club – 1895), but some of the most important early inventions for golf as well as golf architects lived and worked in Wheaton. The event is free and open to the public, although [registration is required on the library's website](#).

to the development of golf in the USA.

Tickets are \$5 per person for the tour with proceeds benefiting Historic Commission programs. All tour participants will receive a Wheaton Golf History map with the locations marked.

# Prevent Mosquito-Transmitted Diseases

Each year, the Wheaton Mosquito Abatement District (a separate government entity from the City of Wheaton) monitors the area for mosquito-transmitted diseases with the Illinois Department of Health, DuPage County Health Department and Forest Preserve District of DuPage County.

Under the authority of the Illinois Mosquito Abatement District, Clarke Mosquito performs mosquito control activities, including larval site monitoring, biological control and strategic use of EPA-labeled and registered pesticide products, if necessary.

## West Nile Virus

West Nile virus is spread through the bite of infected mosquitoes. Symptoms are initially similar to the flu, with muscle weakness and disorientation. Though the majority of those infected will have mild symptoms or no

symptoms at all, in some individuals, WNV can cause inflammation of the brain (encephalitis) and in severe cases, paralysis, coma or death. The disease is most serious – even fatal – in those with compromised immune systems and the elderly.

In 2017, DuPage County recorded 6 human WNV cases.

## Zika Virus

Zika virus (ZIKV) is a mosquito-borne disease that is transmitted primarily by the *Aedes aegypti* mosquito and sexual transmission. *Aedes aegypti* is a tropical mosquito that does not occur in northern Illinois.

While ZIKV symptoms are generally mild in adults (fever, rash, joint pain and conjunctivitis), pregnant women who contract ZIKV can pass the virus to their unborn children, increasing the risks of serious birth defects like microcephaly.

continental United States recorded more than 5,100 travel-related cases of ZIKV nationwide and 139 locally transmitted cases in areas of south Florida. In 2017, this diminished in the continental United States, with 407 reported cases, of which 398 were travelers returning from affected areas.

## What You Can Do:

- If outdoors when mosquitoes are active, dress in light-colored, long-sleeved clothing, long pants and socks.
- Apply mosquito repellent with DEET to clothing and exposed skin.
- Neglected swimming pools can be sources for larval development of mosquitoes. Report neglected pools to 1-800-

942-2555 or [wmad@clarke.com](mailto:wmad@clarke.com).

- Discard any outdoor container that might hold water or empty water from wading pools and birdbaths once a week.
- Do not dump grass clippings into low lying areas that collect water after rainfalls.
- Report dead birds on your property to the DuPage County Health Department at 630-682-7400. Dead birds can be the first indicators of the presence of West Nile Virus in the area.
