CITY COUNCIL MEETINGS

IMPORTANT THINGS TO KNOW

Lawn Watering:

Restrictions are in effect from May 15 through Sept. 15. If your address ends in an odd number, you can water your lawn on odd-numbered days, and if your address ends in an even number, you can water on even-numbered days. No watering is allowed on any day between noon and 6 p.m.

Leaf Burning:

You may not burn leaves, but you can compost them or bag them and place them at the curbside pickup with the appropriate sticker.

Library:

Wheaton residents are served by the Wheaton Public Library, located at 225 N. Cross St. Visit the library to register for a library card.

Vehicle Stickers:

The City of Wheaton does not require vehicle stickers.

Overnight Parking:

Parking is not allowed on any City street from 2 a.m. to 6 a.m. If you wish to park on a City street during this time, you must submit an online overnight parking request, or call the Police Department at 630-260-2161 to report that your vehicle is on the street. If you do not report your vehicle, it will be ticketed.

Pets:

The City does not require purchase of dog or cat license, but vaccines must be up to date. People walking pets in the City are required to keep them on a leash at all times and clean up animal waste.

Real Estate Transfer Tax:

Required for property purchased or transferring real estate title. Stamps are \$2.50 for every \$1,000 of value.

SETTING UP UTILITY SERVICES

Water/Sewer Service:

Wheaton residents receive Lake Michigan water and are billed monthly for water/sewer service. You will receive a monthly bill from the City as well as a separate bill from the Wheaton Sanitary District or DuPage County for sewage treatment.

Electricity:

ComEd (Commonwealth Edison) is the local electricity service provider to Wheaton residents.

- ▶ *To set up electricity service, call 800-334-7661.*

Gas:

Nicor (Northern Illinois Gas Company) is the local gas provider.

- ▶ *To set up gas service, call 888-642-6748.*

Telephone:

AT&T and Comcast are the local telephone providers.

- ▶ *To contact AT&T, call 800-288-2020..*
- ▶ *To contact Comcast, call 866-594-1234.*

Cable/Video/Internet:

Comcast Cable is the local provider for cable and internet. AT&T also provides internet access in certain neighborhoods.

- ▶ *To set up Comcast service, call 866-594-1234.*
- ▶ *To determine if AT&T service is available, call 800-288-2020.*



HOW TO PAY BILLS FROM THE CITY

You have several options for paying bills issued by the City:

- Return your payment by mail
- Bring your payment to the Finance Counter at City Hall, 303 W Wesley Street or use the blue drop box located on the west side of City Hall (enter from Wesley Street)
- After you have established service, you can pay online at www.wheaton.il.us/billpay, either by making one-time payments or enrolling in the AUTO PAY program. Wheaton's Online Bill Pay service is available for water/sewer service billing, business license payments, fire alarm monitoring payments, general bills for City services, leased parking permits and parking tickets.

Garbage, Recycling & Yard Waste Service for Residents:

Wheaton's curbside garbage, recycling and yard waste program is provided by Lakeshore Recycling Systems (LRS).

- ▶ To set up your new account, call LRS at: 773-685-8811.
- ▶ For billing or service questions, call LRS at: 773-685-8811.

Residents served by Lakeshore Recycling Systems (LRS) use separate rolling carts for garbage and recycling that are provided by LRS. Carts are available in 35-, 65- and 95-gallon sizes.

You can request different sized carts free of charge for the first 60 days after you take ownership of your new property.

Billing for Service:

Wheaton's program is based on a pay-



for-what-you-use system. LRS charges your account only when your garbage or recycling carts are emptied, using a chip reader to scan sensors in your carts each time they are collected. Charges are based on whether it is garbage or recycling being picked up and the size of the cart. See the tables below to determine the applicable fees for your service.

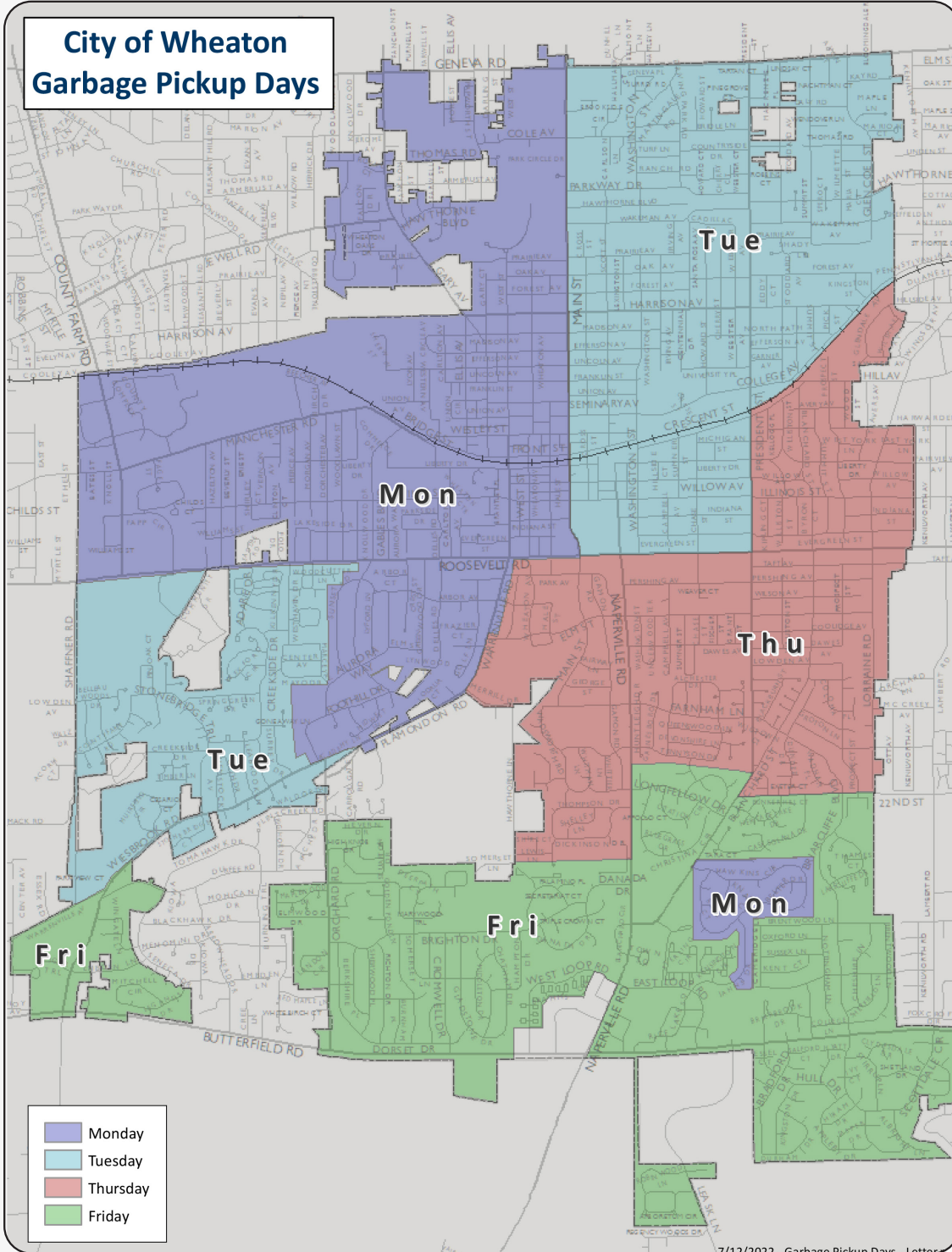

YOUR GARBAGE DAY

Waste, recycling and yard waste are picked up on the same day. Please refer to the map above to determine your pick-up day. Carts may be placed curbside after 7 p.m. the night before collection or before 6 a.m. the day of your collection. Please remove your carts by 7 p.m. on your collection day.

YARD WASTE & ORGANIC MATERIALS



Yard waste, food scraps and organic materials are collected at the curb from the first full week of April through the second full week of December.

You can use containers no larger than 35 gallons or biodegradable paper bags. Each container or biodegradable bag must weigh no more than 50 pounds and must have one yard waste/organics/garbage sticker attached in order to be collected. You can mix yard waste, food scraps and organic materials in the same bag/container, as they are composted together.

STICKERS FOR EXCESS GARBAGE, YARD WASTE, ELECTRONICS & MORE

Stickers are required for yard waste, organics and bulk items. Some items, such as bulk items and electronics, require more stickers than others.

HOW MANY STICKERS?

1 sticker per:

- excess bag of garbage
- biodegradable yard waste bag/container
- stack of brush/tree trimmings (no more than 4 feet long, 18 inches diameter)
- single e-waste item (excludes TVs and monitors)

5 stickers per:

- bulk item (i.e. mattress, toilet)
- e-waste bundle (place in brown paper grocery-sized bag)
- roll of carpeting

10 stickers per:

- "white good" (refrigerator, water heater)
- TV or computer monitor
