

Time Capsule Dedication Nov. 7

Thanks to the participation of residents, Wheaton schools and community groups, the City collected an eclectic mix of items for a time capsule set to be opened on Wheaton's bicentennial anniversary in 2059.

In June, the City unearthed a time capsule from 1959 and displayed the contents during a community event in Memorial Park as part of its yearlong sesquicentennial celebration. To continue the tradition, the City has created a new time capsule to be opened in 50 years.
